The Lord said to gird your loins and listen closely, for I, the great I AM, have much to say. God healed and honored Job. God noticed it all.

The author, Chuck Swindoll says that a major goal of the wholesome, healthy Christian is the hope of reaching maturity before death overtakes us. Hopefully we are all growing up as we grow older. The two should walk hand-in-hand. Maturing is a slow process, and in many cases a painful and arduous process. Job accomplished it and reached the goal. We read that Job lived 140 additional years, full of enthusiasm and passion. What an enviable way to finish life!

In regard to Job's story, what nuggets of knowledge can we receive and apply to our daily walk?

- 1. God does not forget, He just doesn't adjust His plan to our timetable.
- 2. God's account/settlement desk doesn't operate on a 9 to 5 schedule.
- 3. God doesn't necessarily handle our cases when we want them handled. Selah...

God stayed quiet through all the insults hurled toward Job, all the sarcastic speeches from the three Talking Heads! God then told Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar to heed His words, because He was an angry God!

Aren't we thankful that the veil was rent and there is forgiveness for our sin! When trouble comes, we have two options. We can view it as intrusion, or as an opportunity to respond in obedience to God. Endurance is not jaw-clinched resignation, but pursuing holiness when the conditions of holiness aren't favorable. Oswald Chambers wrote, "to choose suffering makes no sense at all, but to choose God's will in the midst of our suffering, makes all the sense in the world." *Bro. Harold*
